Ladino, or Judeo-Spanish, is the language of Sephardic Jews—descendants of those expelled from Spain in 1492—carrying centuries of migration, memory, and cultural exchange. Written in Hebrew-based scripts, it developed a rich print and writing tradition across the Ottoman world.

Solitrete sits at the center of this tradition as a curative, handwritten script used for everyday communication. Fluid, fast, and highly personal, it moves away from rigid typographic systems and instead reflects rhythm, gesture, and individual expression. Ganchos Sans builds from this foundation, translating the structural logic of Solitrete into a contempo-

rary sans-serif typeface. Rather than imitating the script, it reinterprets its hooks, flows, and connections for modern use—bridging historical writing practices with current design language.
